NRCHA Stakes Herd Work Finals Complete; Camilla The Cat & Jake Telford Lead Open



Camilla The Cat, shown by Jake Telford for owner Newt White, scored a 219 to lead the NRCHA Stakes Open Finals herd work.

Contenders for the 2014 National Reined Cow Horse Association Stakes Championships took the first step in their finals journey Friday, April 4 at the South Point Equestrian Center in Las Vegas, Nev., as they competed in the herd work.

Leading the Stakes Open division, with a 219, is Camilla The Cat (WR This Cats Smart x Bit Of Starlight x Grays Starlight), a 2010 mare owned by Newt White and shown by NRCHA Million-Dollar Rider Jake Telford.

The Stakes Intermediate Open leader is Peptos Smart Remedy (Peptoboonsmal x Ima Smart Remedy x Smart Little Lena), a 2009 stallion shown by NRCHA Million-Dollar Rider Jon Roeser and owned by Sprig Haven Farms, also with a 219.

Shannon McCarty Leads All Stakes Non Pro Divisions on Hick Olena

The overall high score of the day belonged to Shannon McCarty, riding her 2009 gelding, Hick Olena (Hick Chicaroo x Miss Ann Olena x Miss N Cash). They scored a

222, and now lead three divisions: the Non Pro, Intermediate Non Pro and Novice Non



Non Pro Bridle Spectacular Champion

Wolfforth, Texas, horseman Parke Greeson sealed the NRCHA Stakes Non Pro Bridle Spectacular Championship with a sparkling fence work. Riding Lenas Alley (Smart Little Lena x Doc Alley x Dual Pep), Greeson scored a total 652.5 (217.5 herd/212.5 rein/222.5 cow), earning \$3,420.

The win came with some terrific prizes: a C.R. Morrison trophy from the NRCHA; a gift certificate and cooler tote bag from NRCHA Corporate Partner San Juan Ranch, a division of Santa Cruz Animal Health; and product from NRCHA Corporate Partner Platinum Performance.

Greeson's score also netted the Intermediate Non Pro Bridle Championship, which added another \$960 to his earnings, another Morrison trophy to his awards collection, and more Platinum Performance to his supplement stash.
