- Downtown Pilot Point is on the National Register of Historic Places, but also can boast as the home to one of the largest-growing spirit brands in the country! Visit Western Son Vodka while in downtown. The distillery tasting room is open Thursday through Saturday, and distillery tours are Saturday afternoons with tickets required. westernsondistillery.com

- Stop by on your way to or from the 2021 Snaffle Bit Futurity® and the downtown activities and festivals include

Bonnie & Clyde Days in October. The festival commemorates the filming of the bank robbery scene from the 1967 classic film *Bonnie & Clyde*, which was done in town! bonnieandclydedays.com

- Get slightly out of town for top-notch fishing and watersports! Just Two miles east of downtown is Lake Ray Roberts State Park, the most recent host of the Bassmaster Classic fishing tournament. The state park, which boasts a 30,000-acre lake that is a premier bass fishing spot, also has a plethora of additional activities for every outdoors enthusiast, from camping to birding and other lake activities.
